Description of job roles under PCP	 There are three professions offered under the PCP: Physiotherapists (PT) focus on implementing evidence-based techniques to enable clients to achieve optimal independence in movement and function. Occupational Therapists (OT) use outcome and evidence-based practice in their evaluation, intervention, consultation, supervision and education of their clients to perform tasks in living, working, playing and schooling. Diagnostic Radiographers (DR) manage technology to produce, display, manipulate, transmit and archive radiographic images to aid the healthcare team in diagnosing illness or injury. Funding Support and Estimated PCP Training Allowance	There will be funding support by WSG, Ministry of Health (MOH) and co-sponsoring healthcare organisations for trainees. Course fees will be fully sponsored for all eligible trainees. Trainees will receive training allowances ranging from \$2,100 to \$2,450 per month throughout the training, pegged to their years of prior work experience. General PCP eligibility criteria:

- Singapore Citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents*
- Graduated or completed National Service for at least two years, whichever is most recent

General PCP Eligibility Criteria

*Singapore Permanent Residents who have utilised their MOE Tuition Grant in a local public university are not eligible to apply for the four-year PT/OT/DR programme. You may check with MOE if you are unsure whether you have received Tuition Grant for your previous studies.

All Singapore Citizens, regardless of MOE Tuition Grant status, are eligible to apply for the PT/OT/DR programmes.

SIT's Academic Pre-Requisites

Applicants must meet any one of the following pre-requisites:

A-Level Pre-requisites:

A good pass in two of the following H2 subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics; and offered General Paper (GP) or Knowledge & Inquiry (KI) in the same sitting while satisfying the Mother Tongue (MTL) requirements.

Diploma Prerequisites:

An approved full-time diploma from a local Polytechnic. Module exemption will be considered on a case-by-case basis. For the list of relevant diplomas, please refer to the SIT website.

SIT's Academic criteria

Diplomas that are not listed may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Applicants will be assessed for admissions based on a holistic approach if they meet the following admission criteria:

- 1. Obtained a Science-related full-time local Polytechnic diploma and/or
- 2. Acquired relevant full-time work experience of one to two years.
- International Baccalaureate Prerequisites:

A good pass in two of the following: HL Biology, HL Chemistry, HL Physics and HL Mathematics; and one Standard Level (SL) subject while satisfying the Mother Tongue (MTL) requirements.

Applicants to the **PCP for Physiotherapists** who have a Science-related honours degree from a recognised university may be offered a place by SIT in the two-year eight-month accelerated PCP-PT programme.

- Anatomy and Physiology
- o Allied Health
- Nursing and Medicine
- Life Sciences / Biomedical Sciences
- Other Health Sciences
- Other degrees will be considered on a case-by-case basis

Selection shall be solely at the discretion of SIT and will depend upon the number of places available in the programme.

Description of training

Successful applicants will undergo a four-year full-time PT, OT or DR degree programme conducted at SIT, comprising on-campus training and clinical attachments in different care settings.

Applicants who are offered a place in the accelerated PCP-PT programme will undergo a two-year eight-month full-time PT degree programme.

Upon graduation, trainees will be awarded with a Bachelor of Science with Honours in their respective field. Individuals will be eligible for registration with the Singapore Allied Health Professionals Council (AHPC) and obtain the license to practise as a PT, OT or DR.
