

<b>PCP Title</b>	<b>PCP for Allied Health Professionals – Physiotherapist / Occupational Therapist / Diagnostic Radiographer</b>														
<b>Mode of PCP</b>	Train-and-Place (With Commitment to Hire). Trainees will be co-sponsored by a participating healthcare or social service organisation and will serve their bond at their sponsoring organisations after training completion.														
<b>Sector</b>	Healthcare/Social Service														
<b>Description of job roles under PCP</b>	<p>There are three professions offered under the PCP:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>1. Physiotherapists (PT)</b> focus on implementing evidence-based techniques to enable clients to achieve optimal independence in movement and function.</li> <li><b>2. Occupational Therapists (OT)</b> use outcome and evidence-based practice in their evaluation, intervention, consultation, supervision and education of their clients to perform tasks in living, working, playing and schooling.</li> <li><b>3. <b>Funding Support and Estimated PCP Training Allowance</b>	<p>There will be funding support by WSG, Ministry of Health (MOH) and co-sponsoring healthcare organisations for trainees.</p> <p><b>Course fees</b> will be fully sponsored for all eligible trainees. Trainees will receive <b>training allowances</b> ranging from \$2,100 to \$2,450 per month throughout the training, pegged to their years of prior work experience. <p>General PCP Eligibility Criteria</p>	<p><b>General PCP eligibility criteria:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Singapore Citizens or Singapore Permanent Residents*</li> <li>• Graduated or completed National Service for at least two years, whichever is most recent</li> </ul> <p><i>*Singapore Permanent Residents who have utilised their MOE Tuition Grant in a local public university are not eligible to apply for the four-year PT/OT/DR programme. You may check with MOE if you are unsure whether you have received Tuition Grant for your previous studies.</i></p> <p><i>All Singapore Citizens, regardless of MOE Tuition Grant status, are eligible to apply for the PT/OT/DR programmes.</i></p>
<p>SIT's Academic criteria</p>	<p><b>SIT's Academic Pre-Requisites</b></p> <p>Applicants must meet any one of the following pre-requisites:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>A-Level Pre-requisites:</b> A good pass in two of the following H2 subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics; and offered General Paper (GP) or Knowledge &amp; Inquiry (KI) in the same sitting while satisfying the Mother Tongue (MTL) requirements.</li> <li>• <b>Diploma Prerequisites:</b> An approved full-time diploma from a local Polytechnic. Module exemption will be considered on a case-by-case basis. For the list of relevant diplomas, please refer to the SIT website.</li> </ul> <p>Diplomas that are not listed may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Applicants will be assessed for admissions based on a holistic approach if they meet the following admission criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Obtained a Science-related full-time local Polytechnic diploma and/or</li> <li>2. Acquired relevant full-time work experience of one to two years.</li> </ol> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>International Baccalaureate Prerequisites:</b> A good pass in two of the following: HL Biology, HL Chemistry, HL Physics and HL Mathematics; and one Standard Level (SL) subject while satisfying the Mother Tongue (MTL) requirements.</li> <li>• <b>NUS High School Diploma Prerequisites:</b> A good pass in two of the following: Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics.</li> </ul>

	<p>Applicants to the <b>PCP for Physiotherapists</b> who have a Science-related honours degree from a recognised university may be offered a place by SIT in the two-year eight-month accelerated PCP-PT programme.</p> <p>Examples of Science-related honours degrees include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <i>Exercise and Sports Sciences</i></li> <li>○ <i>Anatomy and Physiology</i></li> <li>○ <i>Allied Health</i></li> <li>○ <i>Nursing and Medicine</i></li> <li>○ <i>Life Sciences / Biomedical Sciences</i></li> <li>○ <i>Other Health Sciences</i></li> <li>○ <i>Other degrees will be considered on a case-by-case basis</i></li> </ul> <p>Shortlisted applicants will be invited to undergo <b>Multiple Mini Interviews</b> at SIT as part of the selection process. Description of training	<p>Successful applicants will undergo a four-year full-time PT, OT or DR degree programme conducted at SIT, comprising on-campus training and clinical attachments in different care settings.</p> <p>Applicants who are offered a place in the accelerated PCP-PT programme will undergo a two-year eight-month full-time PT degree programme.</p> <p>Upon graduation, trainees will be awarded with a Bachelor of Science with Honours in their respective field. Individuals will be eligible for registration with the Singapore Allied Health Professionals Council (AHPC) and obtain the license to practise as a PT, OT or DR.</p>
